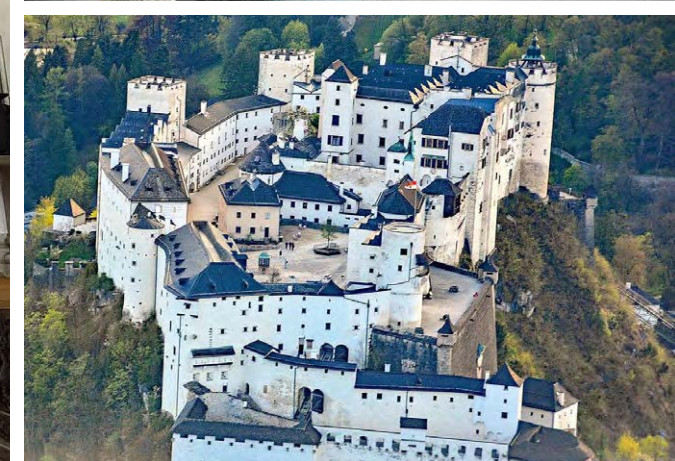
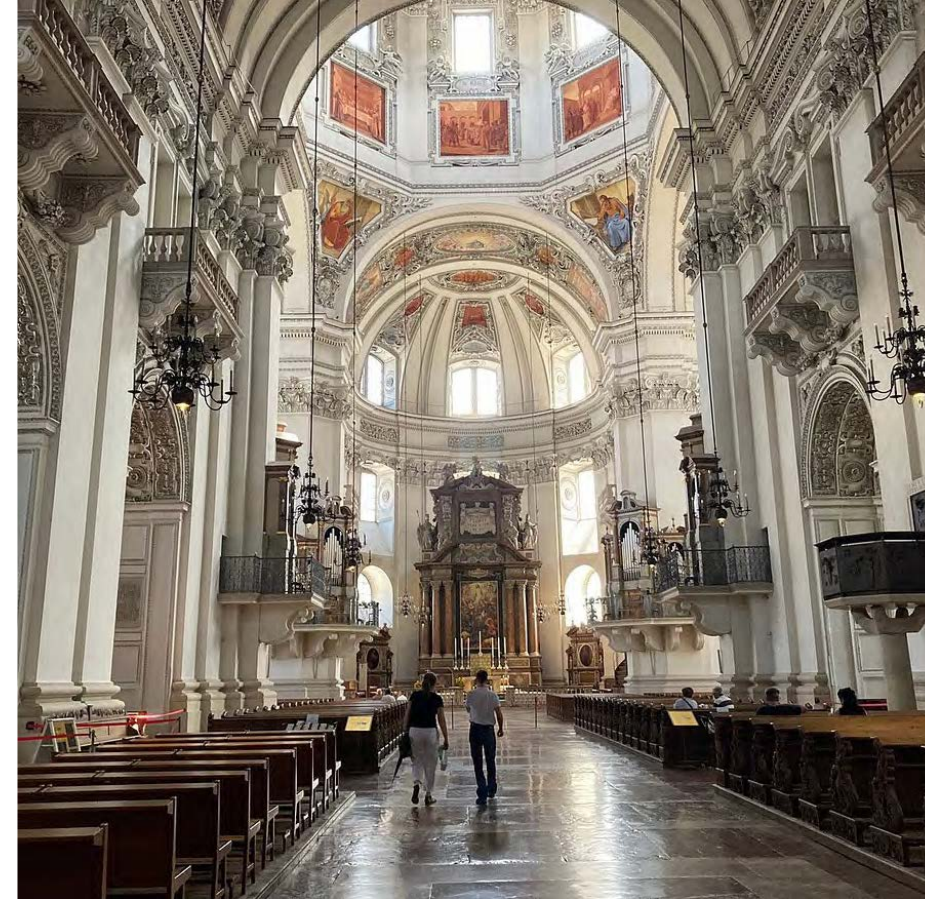
Explore Vienna's Naschmarkt, Leopold Museum, and Spanish Riding School; enjoy a dinner concert at Schönbrunn Palace.

OVERVIEW FROM PAGE TO STAGE

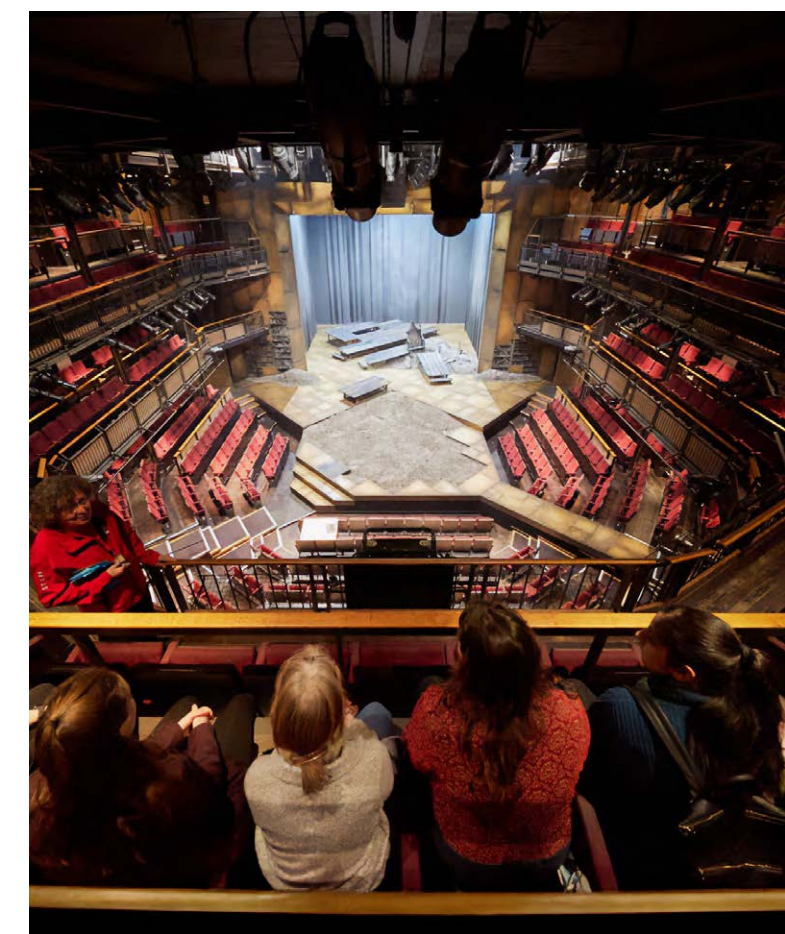

Designed in collaboration with the world-renowned Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC), this week-long camp will help students develop their performance technique, build confidence, and explore creative expression under the guidance of expert RSC practitioners. Through a combination of dynamic workshops, rehearsals, and ensemble-building activities led by two RSC Practitioners, students will sharpen their storytelling skills and work towards a final showcase performance, where they will share their progress and newfound talents with peers and mentors.

Beyond the rehearsal room, students will gain unparalleled access to the RSC, attending live performances at the company's iconic theatres, participating in exclusive artist Q&A sessions, and engaging in behind-the-scenes experiences that bring Shakespeare's works to life. This immersive journey will deepen

their appreciation of theatre while fostering critical 21st-century skills such as collaboration, communication, and creative thinking. Most importantly, the camp is a chance to connect with like-minded peers, experience British culture firsthand, and have fun in an inspiring environment that blends history, artistry, and innovation.

The Summer School is open to students who have finished Year 7/Grade 6 and above.

The students will be accommodated at the historic Swan's Nest hotel: a comfortable haven located far enough from the hustle and bustle to offer peaceful relaxation while being a very short, level walk across the river from the historic heart of Stratford-upon-Avon and the Royal Shakespeare Company.

Dating back to the late 17th Century, the Swan's Nest was originally 'The Bear', a name retained by the atmospheric freehouse – with a blazing central fireplace – which is part of the hotel. Two of the earliest brick houses in Stratford provided the foundations for today's Swan's Nest, which has 72 bedrooms, from comfortable Club Doubles to



spacious, sumptuous suites. Students can choose to stay in Single or Twin rooms.

Parents are invited to join their children in Stratford-upon-Avon, where they can enjoy an authentic British summer holiday. The town offers a wealth of activities, from exploring its rich history on guided walks to relaxing on a peaceful boat ride along the tranquil River Avon or indulging in delicious brunches and refreshing drinks while enjoying the serene atmosphere of lush gardens. Although the workshops are dedicated to students only, parents are welcome to attend the final performance on Friday afternoon, showcasing the students' hard work and creativity. 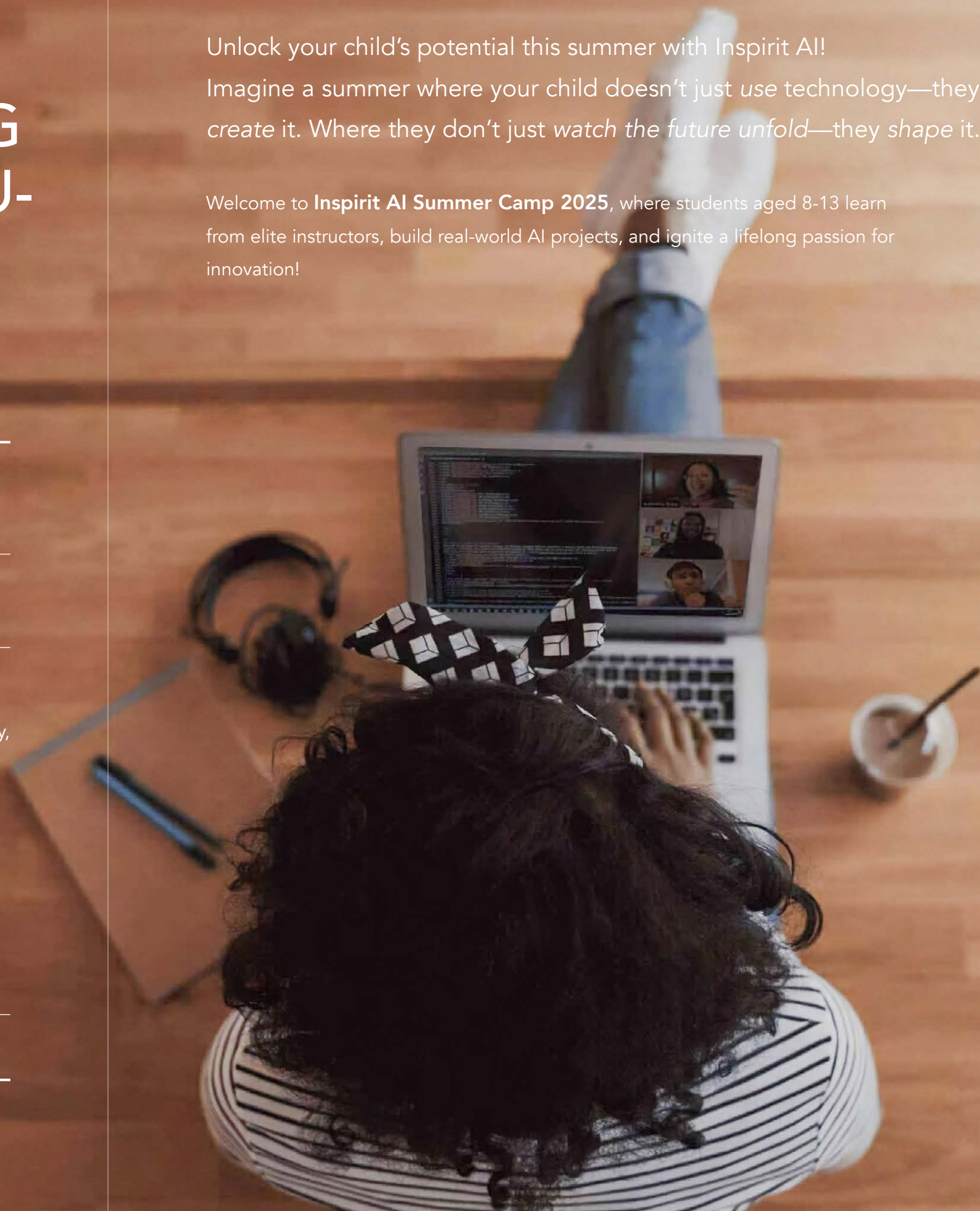

Participants engage in hands-on projects such as **robotics**, **mock trials**, and **entrepreneurship**, honing **critical thinking** and **leadership skills** under the guidance of expert faculty, over 70% of whom hold advanced degrees, in **small class settings**.

INTRODUCTION

From 2013 to 2025, DDC Academy introduced high-quality gifted education resources from countries such as the US and the United Kingdom. Over this period, about 60 academic camps, each lasting 2-3 weeks, were held at institutions including the BSB, ISB, Keystone, BIBS, BCIS, Haidian Kaiwen Academy, YK Pao School in Shanghai, Shanghai Pinghe School, Dulwich College Shanghai Pudong, The British International School Shanghai Puxi, and Shenzhen Foreign Languages School. 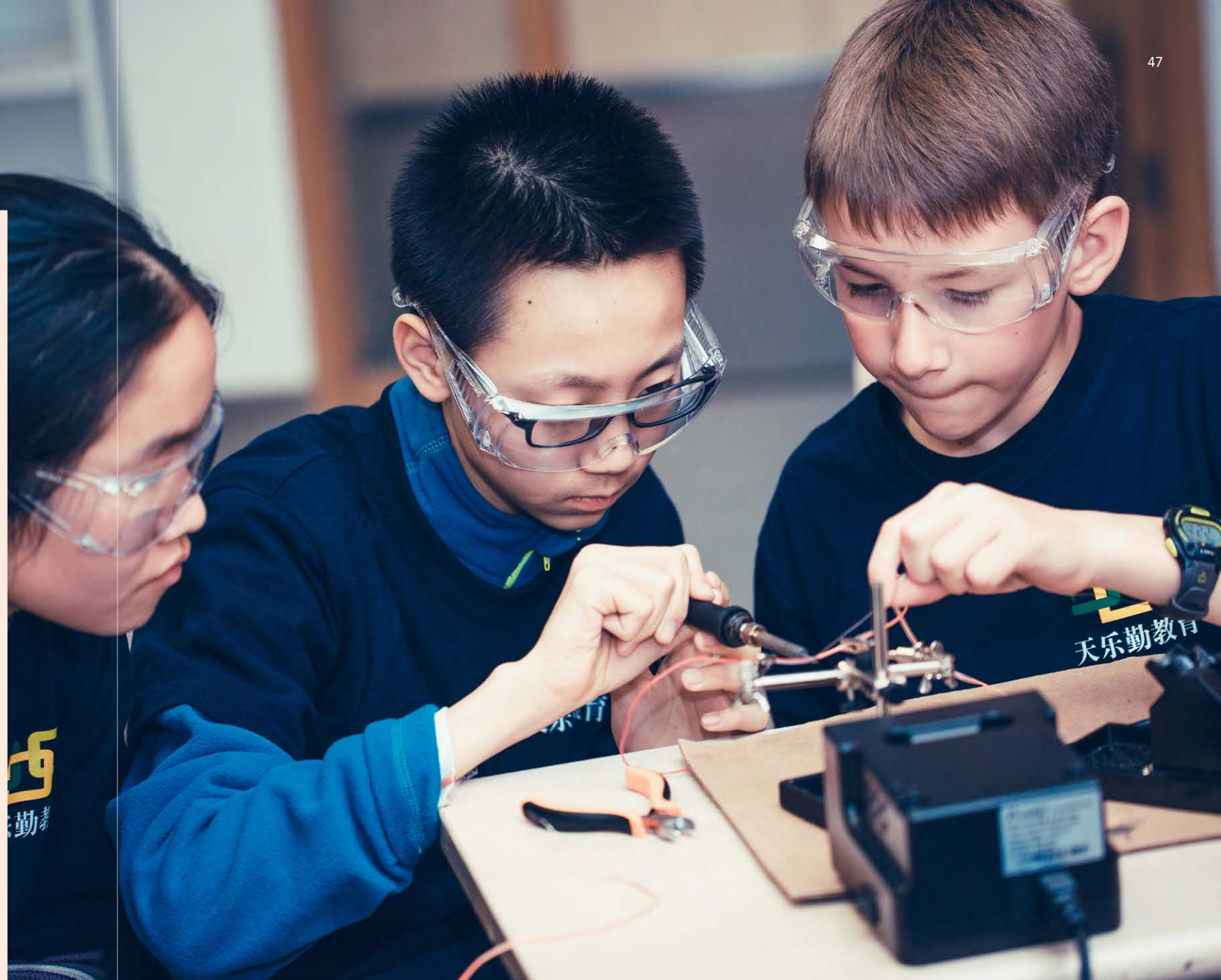
Admission Notification & Payment

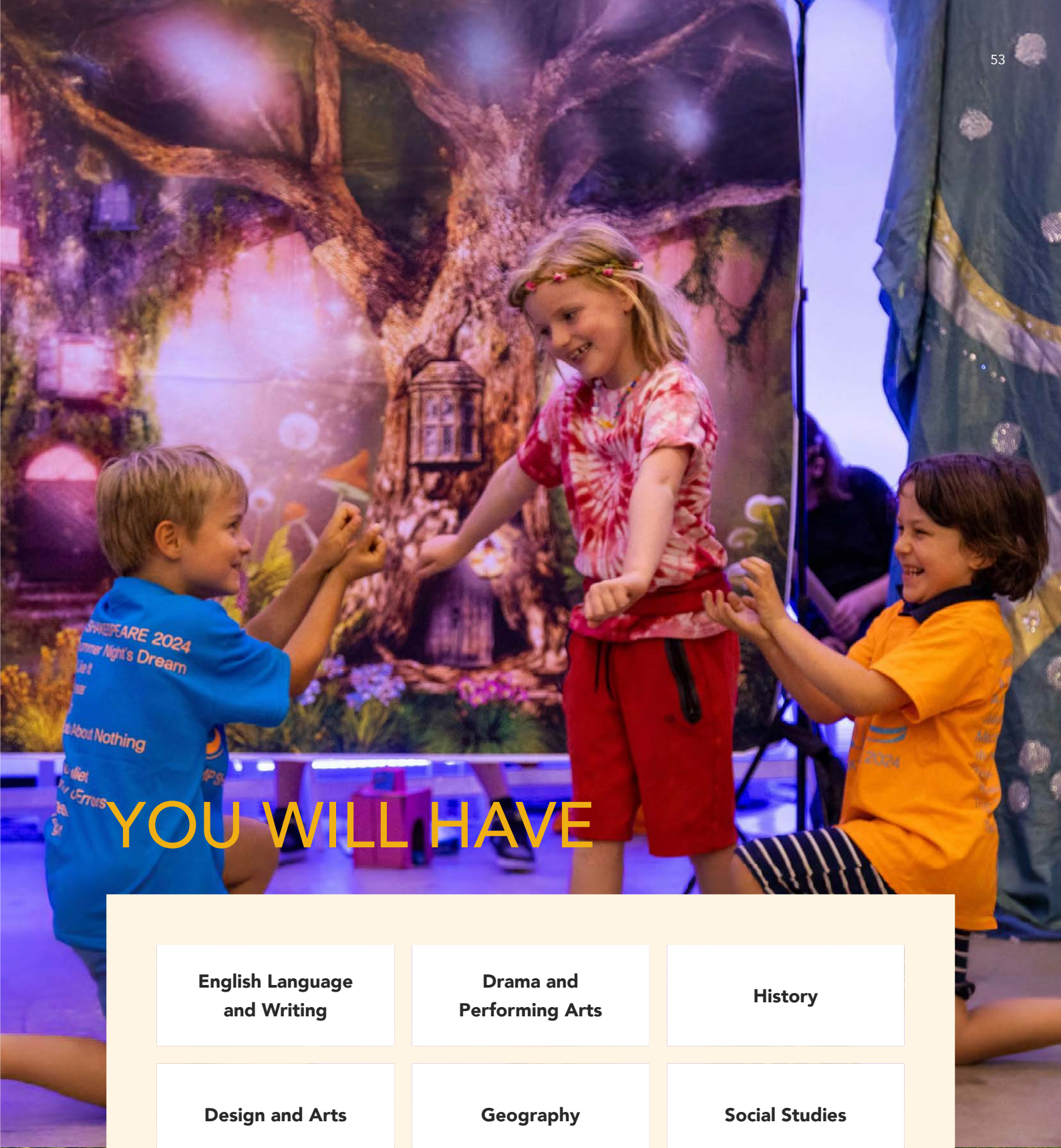

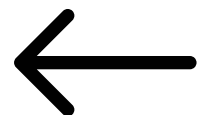


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
